Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC)

CCA is an association comprised of counseling professionals that supports professional education, advocacy and service throughout Connecticut.

LPCs are licensed through the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health.



What do Licensed Professional Counselors do?

Licensed Professional Counselors assess and treat clients who are experiencing challenges in their psychological, intellectual, emotional, moral, vocational, or interpersonal growth. They focus on healthy development throughout the lifespan. They facilitate growth and wellness for their clients.

Licensed Professional Counselors are trained to provide comprehensive mental health care, including intake, assessment, diagnosis, treatment planning, crisis management and coordination of services.

Licensed Professional Counselors work with adults, children, groups, families and couples in a variety of settings (clinics, hospitals, schools, universities, residential facilities, career centers, state agencies and private practice).

—QUALIFICATIONS OF LPCs—

- Masters or Doctoral degree in Counseling from an accredited program focusing on –
 - * Counseling Theories & Practice
 - * Human Growth & Development
 - * Social and Cultural Foundations
 - * Group Dynamics & Counseling
 - * Career Development & Counseling
 - * Assessment
 - * Research & Program Evaluation
 - * Counselor Professional Identity & Practice Issues
 - * Practicum & Internship
- A minimum of 3,000 hours of post-graduate experience and 100 hours of supervision
- Passage of a state-approved licensing exam and participation in continuing education for licensure renewal
- Can be nationally certified through the National Board of Certified Counselors
- Adherence to the Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice set forth by the American Counseling Association
- Licensure requirements are equivalent to those for clinical social workers and marriage and family therapists
